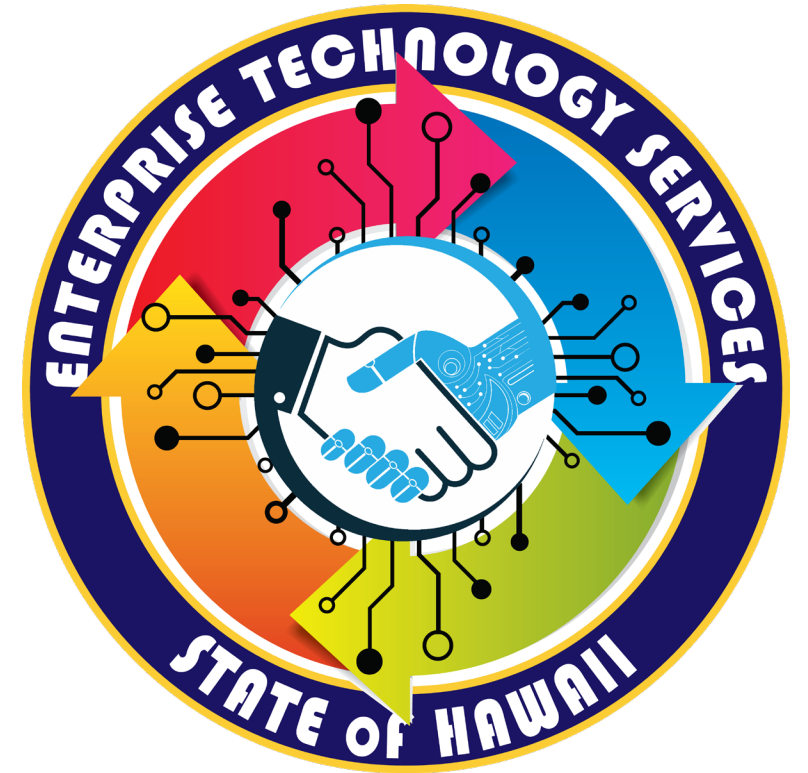

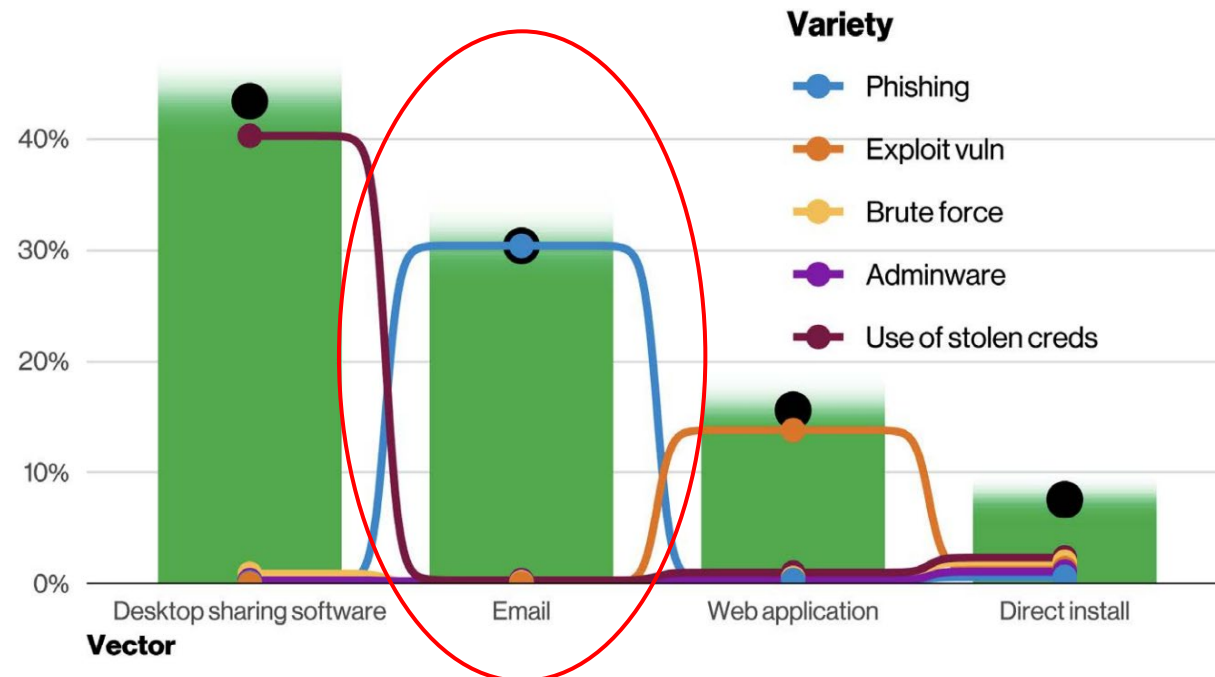

# Problem

- Many link / URL shorteners are blocked from within the state network because they've been repeatedly identified to share malicious links.
- Malicious links delivered through e-mail and web is often a precursor to data breaches and ransomware attacks.



# Ask



Create a link shortener for state agencies to be used as trusted short links to be used in external and internal communications.



Protect the State of Hawaii's branding. By using a trusted service, malicious links are less likely to be followed and shared.

# Why .gov?



## **Official websites use .gov**

A .gov website belongs to an official government organization in the United States.



## **Secure .gov websites use HTTPS**

A lock or https:// means you've safely connected to the .gov website. Share sensitive information only on official, secure websites.
